Successful completion of this examination is required as one of the conditions for licensure in the State of Vermont.

3. If you had **more than** six incorrect, you need to review those incorrect questions and the Board's Laws and Rules to find the correct answer. You must resubmit the answer sheet with the changes noted in Red.
4. If you had **fewer than** six incorrect, we encourage you to review those incorrect questions and the Board's Laws and Rules to find the correct answer.
